# COI QUERY RESPONSE - IRAQ

## Penal and Criminal Codes in Iraq and the KRI

### Information on whether the Kurdistan Region of Iraq applies the same Penal and Criminal Codes as the Central Government

National Iraqi courts are responsible for applying the Iraqi Penal Code No 111 of 1969<sup>1</sup> and the Iraqi Criminal Procedures Code No 23 of 1971<sup>2</sup>, in line with general constitutional guarantees relating to the punishment of crime.<sup>3</sup> In the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KRI), the Iraqi Penal Code and Penal Procedure Code apply.<sup>4</sup> However, the KRI might amend the Criminal Procedure Code as it deems appropriate. In addition, the KRI does not recognise new laws and amendments passed by the central government after 23 October 1991, unless they are enacted into law by the Kurdistan Parliament. As a result, there are significant differences between the procedural codes of the KRI and the central government.<sup>5</sup> An English version of the KRI Criminal Procedure Code, amended on 14 February 2010<sup>6</sup>, is accessible on the website of the Kurdistan Center for International Law (KCIL).<sup>7</sup>
